RESUME AND COVER LETTER

- **Resume:** Use a template and keep it to a single page if possible
- **Cover Letter:** Bookmark this [blog post by Clay Spinuzzi](#)
- **To consider:**
 - If a job ad isn't thoughtful, consider not putting in cover letter
 - Red flags for ads:
 - Outdated tools
 - Won't mention product
 - Won't mention duties and career evolution
 - Doesn't make values clear
 - Very similar to other job descriptions (reused template)
 - Sounds like it came from HR or a recruiter – it doesn't speak to the profession



PERSONAL BRANDING

- Think about these topics:
 - **Past experience:** What makes you unique?
 - **Strengths:** What are your specialties or wheelhouse areas?
 - **Content areas:** What are you interested in and why does it matter?
- Then combine them into your elevator pitch:
 - I am a technical writer with a background in [3 experiences]. I use these skills to [how they inform your work]. In [XYZ industry], I bring these skills to accomplish [XYZ].



JOB BOARDS

- In order of relevant and timely job listings:
 - LinkedIn (Premium if possible)
 - Glassdoor
 - Indeed
 - Editorial Freelance Association jobs (membership required)
 - STC job bank (Writing Assistance, Inc.) (membership required)

ARTICULATE YOUR WRITING PROCESS

- At glance, the writing process looks like this:
 - Gather information and requirements
 - Schedule an interview/demonstration (and record it)
 - Write a draft
 - Ask the SME to review the draft
 - Seek peer review (if possible)
 - Publish

If the hiring manager is also a writer, feel free to ask them about their process too!




DIVERSIFY YOUR SKILLSET

- A diversified skill set means different skills for different industries. What skills could be useful for your chosen industry?
- If you want to expand your skills, there are plenty of free resources to sharpen your non-writing skills. For example, you can learn more about coding through these resources:

 - The Odin Project (Free and Open Source)
 - LinkedIn Learning

- Honor NDAs
- Use password protection on your website or Google Drive
 - Consider that recruiters might view passwords as blockers
